- David Miller began as Principal of Covenant High School in August 2017. Dick Hannula continues to offer behind-the-scenes support and will continue to teach for the school.
- A new hiking club led by Ralph McLin and student leader Haylee Darby was created that completed three hikes during the Fall.
- Created a Women's Tea Time for high school girls for female faculty to provide mentorship to students.
- We are blessed with the highest enrollment in eight years of 109 students.

- Number of graduates 543
- Our underclassmen take the Terra Nova Standardized Achievement Test each spring; over the last three years they have ranked in the top 10% nationally.
- Over the last three years, our students' PSAT scores place them as a group in the top 12% nationally.
- Over the last three years, our students' SAT scores (combined critical reading, math and writing) place them as a group in the top 16% of college-bound seniors nationally.
- In the last three years, 53% of our graduating seniors have been named Washington State Honor Awardees. This is the annual honor awarded to the top 10% of college bound seniors in the state by the Washington State Superintendent of Public Instruction.
- The twelfth UK/France Historical Tour will be happening this Spring. We have taken 11 UK/France Historical Tours involving 582 students and chaperones.
